Criteria 3 A veteran (or their spouse, state-registered domestic partner, or child under 26) who separated or retired from the uniformed services with at least ten years of honorable service and at least 90 days of active-duty service (separation/retirement does not have to be from active duty). 1) This is for students who are not eligible for VA educational or rehabilitation benefits. 2) The student must enter school within three years of the veteran's separation/retirement. 3) Neither the dependent nor the veteran need to live in Washington. 4) The student maintains resident student status as long as they stay continuously enrolled. 5) Does not apply if the veteran had a dishonorable discharge from the uniformed services Required Documents Birth, Adoption, or marriage certificate of the dependent or spouse DD214 Member-4				
Criteria 4 Starting June 9, 2022, military members (including national guard and reservists), veterans, and dependents (spouses, former spouses, and children) who are eligible for VA educational assistance or rehabilitation benefits are eligible for resident tuition. The following guidelines apply: (a) There is no time limit for when the student must enroll. (b) The student does not need to live in Washington. (c) The student does not need to be actively using the benefits. (e) The military member or veteran does not need to serve for a certain amount of time or have a certain type of service. (f) The student maintains resident student status as long as they stay continuously enrolled. The benefits are those defined in Title 38 U.S.C. and Title 10 U.S.C. Chapter 1606. They include: Post-9/11 GI Bill® — Active Duty Montgomery GI Bill® — Active Duty Montgomery GI Bill® — Selected Reserve (for National Guard and Assistance (DEA) Montgomery GI Bill® — Selected Reserve (for National Guard and Reserve members) Chapter 31 Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Required Documents Certificate of Eligibility for VA educational Benefit (or DD-214 (member 4) and at least 10% service-connected disability letter for CH31 VR&E recipients)
